

Post-Operative Instructions for Dental Crowns

1. Numbness & Anesthesia:

- If local anesthesia was used, your lips, tongue, and cheeks may remain numb for several hours.
- Avoid chewing or drinking hot beverages until the numbness wears off to prevent injury.

2. Temporary Crown Care (If Applicable):

- If a **temporary crown** was placed, be cautious when eating. Avoid **sticky**, **hard**, **or chewy foods** that may dislodge it.
- If the temporary crown comes off, **contact our office immediately** to have it re-cemented.
- Brush and floss carefully around the temporary crown—slide the floss out instead of pulling up to avoid loosening it.

3. Sensitivity & Discomfort:

- Some mild sensitivity to hot, cold, or pressure is normal, especially after a temporary crown is placed.
- Over-the-counter pain relievers like ibuprofen or acetaminophen can help manage discomfort.
- If sensitivity persists after the permanent crown is placed, let us know, as an adjustment may be needed.

4. Eating & Drinking:

- After the permanent crown is placed, wait at least 1 hour before eating to allow the cement to fully set.
- Avoid extremely **hard**, **sticky**, **or chewy foods** for the first **24 hours** while the cement fully bonds.

5. Bite Adjustment:

• If your bite feels **uneven** or you experience discomfort while chewing, **contact our office** for an adjustment.

6. Oral Hygiene:

- Brush and floss **normally** around the permanent crown to keep the gums and tooth structure healthy.
- If you experience mild irritation around the gumline, warm saltwater rinses (½ teaspoon salt in 8 oz of water) can help.

7. When to Call the Dentist:

- Persistent pain or sensitivity that lasts more than a few days
- A loose or fallen crown
- Biting discomfort or an uneven bite
- Swelling or signs of infection
