

Post-Operative Instructions for Surgical Dental Extraction

1. Bleeding Control:

- Bite down firmly on the gauze pad placed over the extraction site for 30–45 minutes. If bleeding continues, replace with a fresh gauze pad and bite down for another 30 minutes.
- Slight oozing or pink saliva is normal for the first **24 hours**.
- Avoid spitting, rinsing, using straws, or vigorous sucking for the first 24 hours to prevent dislodging the blood clot (which could cause dry socket).

2. Pain & Swelling Management:

- Some pain and swelling are normal. Use prescribed pain medication or over-the-counter pain relievers (ibuprofen or acetaminophen) as directed.
- Apply an ice pack to the outside of your cheek (20 minutes on, 20 minutes off) for the first 24 hours to reduce swelling.
- Swelling typically peaks within 48 hours and gradually subsides.

3. Diet & Hydration:

- Stick to soft foods (yogurt, mashed potatoes, soup, smoothies) for the first 24–48 hours
- Avoid hot, spicy, crunchy, or hard foods that may irritate the site.
- Drink plenty of water, but avoid using straws to prevent dislodging the clot.

4. Oral Hygiene:

- Do **not** rinse, brush near the extraction site, or use mouthwash for the first **24 hours**.
- After **24 hours**, gently rinse with **warm salt water** (½ teaspoon salt in 8 oz of water) **2–3 times a day**, especially after meals.
- Resume brushing and flossing normally, but be gentle around the extraction site.

5. Rest & Activity:

- Avoid strenuous activities for at least 48 hours, as increased blood pressure can cause bleeding.
- Rest with your head slightly elevated to reduce swelling.

6. Stitches & Healing:

- If **dissolvable stitches** were used, they will fall out on their own within **1–2 weeks**. If non-dissolvable stitches were placed, return for removal as directed.
- Complete healing may take a few weeks to months, depending on the complexity of the extraction.

7. When to Call the Dentist:

- Excessive bleeding that does not stop after applying pressure for 1 hour
- Severe pain that is not relieved by medication
- Signs of infection (fever, worsening swelling, pus, bad taste, or foul odor)
- **Dry socket** symptoms (severe pain 3–5 days after extraction with a bad taste or odor)
- Numbness beyond 24 hours
